



Adding Lamp Posts to Gardens Used for Entertaining

Any size garden can become an entertainment room and [lamp posts](#) for gardens can make a space seem larger than it actually is. A single lamp post will emanate light all around and can provide an ideal base for seating. Just as many people fit a seat around a tree, you can do the same for a lamp post or you could have temporary seating, even casual cushions and a blanket or throw for evening picnics so you can benefit from the fresh air and ambient surroundings.

When a lamp post is the only provider of electric light it might be sensible to set the table near to it and allow torches or candles to provide extra lighting elsewhere. That way you won't have to worry about a breeze flickering candle wax over your food dishes, presenting a fire hazard or blowing out and extinguishing the light source at a buffet or drinks table.



Lamp posts for gardens are available in traditional classic styles as well as eye-catching contemporary designs. They range in height from 1m to 3m and can have a single lantern, a double branch with two lanterns and some even have triple branches supporting three lanterns. What could be more elegant than a slender lamp post welcoming your guests to a patio, gazebo or marquee? These items are more than just perfunctory light providers. They are works of art, statuesque garden furniture in its own right.

Many of us have admired Christmas cards with festive scenes featuring carol singers beneath a lamp post on a snowy night. Lamp posts for gardens might not instill community spirit and you may not wish to invite a party of carol singers to your garden, but the idea is evocative of historical romance. Balconies with balustrades cry out for lamp posts to complete their picture of sophistication. Petite or grand scale, the addition

of lamp posts for gardens along a sweeping drive or hedge or shrub-lined lawns can only be regarded as a final brush stroke on a masterpiece.

Majestic, impressive, lamp posts for gardens can also play a security role if the lamp posts are connected to nearby mounted sensors. There are kits which are activated by movement or others that are sensitive to light levels, and can be set to turn on or off as your requirements dictate. Victorian, colonial or continental styles are all available to enhance your garden, making it an amazing setting for whatever entertainment you might provide for your guests. Some styles are also available as post top lamps if you wish to create a coordinated look on gateposts or walls elsewhere on your property.



Copper, black and white, stainless steel, bronze and green colours offer plenty of choice to coordinate your lamp posts for gardens with fencing, gates, pipework or windows. Smaller lamp posts are ideal for smaller gardens as they match the proportions, but be careful that they are positioned where they avoid presenting a hazard when taller people could bump into the lanterns.
